Book 6:

Account book of Robert Townsend & Co.; Accounts Current 1784, reconciling accounts from circa 1781 to June 1, 1785.

1. Introduction:

This ledger, "Accounts Current – Robert Townsend & C° 1784" is a ledger for individual accounts taken from daily ledgers or journals. Dailies or journals listed all customer sales chronologically and then were transcribed at a later date to a ledger, segregating transactions by customer name. Each customer would have all purchases or debits (D') listed, by year and date, on the left hand page. All payments or credits (C') were listed, also by year and date, on the right hand page. It is interesting to note that some accounts are not settled for two or three years. Robert Townsend, like most other merchants, gave customers credit and accepted payments in cash, commodities or personal services over an extended period of time. The following is an example of payments made by a customer named Thomas Jarvis:

These payments were made in the year 1784 and included cash, cows, and calves, all valued in pounds, shillings and pence. The letters D° is the American-English word for ditto. See Currency Conversions in the Glossary in Appendix I, to convert English denominations to approximate values of dollars (Spanish Dollars) and cents (fraction of Spanish Dollars) in New York money.

There are two different sets of page and ledger numbers: the account pages start with [page A], the table of contents/index of names found in the ledger. As illustrated below, Page A shows customer names and ledger page numbers.

As described above, each account ledger page will list either Debits (D') or Credits (C'). Each of the two pages for Robert Townsend will be identified by ledger page 1.....1 D' and..... C' 1. The following ledger page for James Townsend would begin with 2 D' and C' 2. The following ledger would be 3 D' etc...

The importance of the merchants and shopkeepers in the community should be stressed. The General Store was the equivalent of Walmart, True Value Hardware, LL Bean and United States Post Office all rolled up into one store. People could buy food, shoes, clothing, musket balls, powder, glass panes, and pretty much anything else.

As already mentioned, merchants gave credit to customers because hard money (silver and gold coins) were scarce. Customers were given time to make payments, usually after harvest when the farmer received payment for selling excess wheat, corn or other commodity products. Credit was also given to customers who provided personal services for the shopkeeper. In farming communities where there were dairy cows, farmers produced quantities of butter which was sold to the shopkeeper and in turned sold to nearby larger communities where there was a ready market.

A customer with excellent store credit could direct the merchant to transfer money from his account to pay his debt to a third party. Customers who had credit balances with a third party could transfer that credit to his account where he had a debit balance. These transfers were known as "third party transfers."

Reading through this and other merchant journals and account ledgers and seeing all the contributions made to the community, one has to hold the merchant in high esteem. He bought and sold products grown or manufactured locally. He provided products imported from England, Europe, China and the West Indies. He provided banking services by giving credit to customers and transferring cash for his customers to third parties. This was the way commerce was conducted, and it worked.

Included are three Appendices. Appendix A is a glossary of terms, Appendix B is a listing of all products sold to Townsend's customers, and Appendix C is a list of all names in the account book.

2. Ledger accounts (pages 291-312) (for ledger pages [A], 1-12 (double-sided pagination), and 6 loose sheets, all of manuscript):

[2 sided pagination system was used in the original, i.e. two page 10's, with debit entries on the left sided page, "a" for our pagination purposes, and credit entries (for same account) on the right sided page, "b"].

3a. Appendix – Glossary of terms:

<u>Abbreviations</u> – Ja^s (James); W^m (William); p^s (piece); p^r (per); rw^d (reward); Fred^k (Frederick; Rob^t (Robert); Augst (August); Sept^r (September); Octo^r (October); Nov^r (November); Dec^r (December);

Barrel – a container that usually holds 31½ gallons for most liquids.

<u>Bills of Exchange</u> – a written authorization or order to pay a stated sum of money to a specified person.

Bond – an instrument under which a person guarantees to pay a stated sum of money on or before a specified day.

<u>Bushel</u> – a unit of measure 4 pecks (8 gallons). 1 Bushel of flour is 56 pounds.

<u>Calico (Callico – English spelling)</u> – a plain woven cotton printed with a figured pattern, usually on one side.

<u>Card (Wool)</u> – to prepare wool by special process for combing and paralleling fibers of wool prior to spinning.

<u>Chest</u> – a container such as a chest of tea (60 to 80 pounds)

<u>Currency Conversions</u> - £ (pounds), s (Shillings) and d (pence) to dollars (Spanish Milled Dollars) and cents (Parts of the Spanish Milled Dollar).

The United States mint commenced production in 1793, nine years after the Accounts Current ledger was completed (1784). In 1793, 110,512 one cent copper coins were minted, for a total face value of 1,105.52 dollars (SMD). It wasn't until 1857, 64 years after the U.S. Mint was in operation, that the country had an adequate supply of minted coins in circulation. At that point in time all foreign coins were demonetized. The Spanish Milled dollar played a major role in everyday commerce in Colonial America, and the newly minted U.S. silver dollar was fashioned after this foreign coin.

The SMD was valued at 8s (shillings) or 96d (pence) New York money. The following values are for the £, s and d in New York money: 1£ = 2.50 SMD, 1s = .125 cents and 1d = .01042 cents. Converting £6 . 7s . 6d to dollars and cents:

 $(6 \times 2.50) + (7 \times .125) + (6 \times .01042) = 15 + .875 + .0625 = 15.9375$ or 15.94 dollars

<u>Firkin</u> – a small wooden vessel or tub for butter or lard, usually 56 pounds, 8 gallons of ale or beer.

<u>Frieze</u> – a Heavy woolen cloth.

Hogshead – a large cask, one containing from 63 to 140 gallons.

<u>Hundredweight (cwt)</u> – 100 Troy pounds.

Loaves – a shaped or molded mass (a loaf of sugar).

<u>Marseilles</u> – a thick cotton fabric woven in figures or stripes, chiefly for bed spreads and other coverings.

Note – a written promise to pay.

<u>Pipe</u> – a container holding 126 gallons of wine, spirits, cider or vinegar.

<u>Porter</u> – a mixture of ale beer and tuppenney. A tuppeney was a beer with less alcohol and sold 2d (2 pence) for a pint.

<u>Puncheon</u> – a container holding 72 gallons of ale, beer or porter; 84 gallons of wine, spirits, cider or vinegar; 90-100 gallons of rum.

<u>Reward</u> – pay a person for a service.

<u>Saltpeter</u> – (saltpeter is the English spelling) Potasium nitrate used in manufacturing gunpowder.

<u>Say</u> – a thin silk or woolen fabric similar to serge.

Serge – a woolen fabric used for clothes.

<u>Teas</u> – Bohea (black tea); Hyson (green tea); Souchong tea (Black tea); all three teas were imported from China.

<u>Tick</u> – The cloth case of mattress or pillow.

<u>Tierce</u> – 42 gallons of wine, spirits, cider or vinegar.
