

A meeting of the Managers of the E. H. Free Library was held at the Library on the afternoon of June 22nd 1907.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and accepted. The report of the Treas. showed a balance on hand of about \$327^{00/100}. This report was accepted. The Book Com. was authorized to purchase books for the Library to the amount of \$75.00.

A motion was made and carried that the Library be kept open every day during the months of July, August and September. A motion was made and carried that Mr. Manson write an appeal for the Library to be placed in the books given to certain cottage people who have never given any subscriptions for the support of the Library. Miss Hedges, the Librarian, gave an interesting report concerning the work of the past winter. It was suggested that one evening a week during the winter might be given entirely for the children of the village.
