

A special meeting of the Managers of the E. H. Free Library was held on the afternoon of June 11, 1914, eight of the managers being present.

The object of the meeting was to decide upon the advisability of opening the Library both morning and afternoon every day during the summer.

After a lengthy discussion it was thought best to keep the same hours for opening the Library until more funds were available.

This seemed the only wise decision, although all the managers were heartily in favor of opening the Library to the public if the necessary money could be procured.

It was suggested that an appeal be sent through the Star, stating the facts clearly.

Meeting adjourned on motion.

The regular meeting of the Managers of the E. H. Free Library was held Thursday afternoon June 25, 1914, five of the Managers being present.

The minutes of the last meeting and also of a special meeting were read and accepted.

Motion made and carried that the Library be opened, as an experiment, every day except Sunday, from 10 to 12 A. M. and from 2 to 6 P. M., also Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday evenings from 7:30 to 9.

Motion made and carried that we offer Miss Hedges fifty-two dollars (\$52.⁰⁰/₁₀₀) per month while the Library is opened every day and that we engage Miss Nettie Edwards at five dollars (\$5.00) per week as assistant librarian.

Motion made and carried that the Secretary write Mr. Thompson asking him if the name of Dr. Monroe would be acceptable as a member of the Advisory Board to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Dr. Herrick.

The Sec. was asked to draft resolutions on the death of Dr. Herrick and present same at the July meeting.

The meeting adjourned, on motion.
