



The Home Builder's Guild of Montauk Long Island, Architectural Designs by Dr. Francis LeRoy Satterlee, 1927

Looking to build your dream house on the South Fork? There was a time when the [Home Builder's Guild of Montauk Long Island](#) could have helped you with that, proclaiming to be your one stop shop for designing and building your perfect, coastal country home. The 1927 drawing and plans above, created by Dr. Francis LeRoy Satterlee, were for a house in the Tudor Revival style, complete with private study, four bedrooms, two bathrooms, and a separate two-car garage. The Home Builder's Guild of Montauk seems to have been operated under Albin Pearson, a contractor and builder behind many of entrepreneur Carl Fisher's building projects in Montauk during the 1920's, which not only included homes, but the Montauk Manor, Montauk Yacht Club, roadways, and other infrastructure. The [Long Island Collection](#) has an important collection of architectural drawings, surveys, and [blueprints](#), dating from approximately the late 1800s to the 1940s, of local homes and other structures. Only a small selection is currently digitized, however, it's our intention to make more of them accessible on [Digital Long Island](#) in the future. We welcome your visit to see the Collection in person.
